19 May 2016 at the Kings Arms, Taunton

1. Apologies for absence

Mark Lockett KERNO (Treasurer); Erik Peckett DEVON (committee); Dick Keighley (committee); Jeff Butt SARUM (committee, SWJOS); Carolyn Dent SARUM; Caroline Craig NGOC.

2. Approval of Minutes for the SWOA meeting of 16 March 2016

Para. 8.1.a should read: Planners' course, KERNO, 30 November 2015. The minutes were then approved as a correct record.

3. Matters arising from those minutes

4. Acknowledgements

5. Finance

5.1 Treasurer and Membership Secretary's report.

Income and Expenditure since 01 August 2015 - 14 May 2016. Balance in hand is £9882.96. [See Appendix 1.](#)

5.2 Budget for SWOA. It was noted that no money has been allocated for a Club Conference (SWOA Planners' conference proposed for 10 December 2016). Katy Dyer asked that money for SWOA sponsored courses is shown and described in the next budget. [Mark Lockett, Christine Vince](#)

5.3 Grants

5.3.1 Grant request for Becca Jackson NWO to attend UKCC Level 2 course at Plas-y-Brenin; Becca has been appointed as Association Coaching Representative. Noted that full cost will be £695, to which all agreed. [Mark Lockett](#)

5.3.2 Grant request for Jenny Jones NWO to attend the same UKCC Level 2 course. NWO needs coaches urgently for a successful club night at Chippenham. 50% of cost agreed (i.e. £347.50). [Mark Lockett](#)

5.3.3 Grant request of £750 (athlete's contribution) from Tom Dobra BUOC for European TrailO Championships, 21-30 May 2016 (he is an adult full time student). This included £100 for food, which left £650; suggested grant of £325 (i.e. 50% of £650).

Proposed Richard Sansbury, seconded Nicholas Maxwell. All agreed. He also has a £200 grant from the Orienteering Foundation. [Mark Lockett](#)

5.3.4 Grant request from Adam Potter BOK for £360 (athlete's contribution) for World Cup Poland; (he is an adult full time student). Suggested grant of £180 (i.e. 50% of £360). Proposed Richard Sansbury, seconded Nicholas Maxwell. All agreed. [Mark Lockett](#)

5.3.5 Clubs are reminded that all grants must be applied for in advance and are discretionary.

6. Fixtures

Fixtures' Secretary's report. Richard Sansbury is continuing to seek host clubs for the following fixtures: British Schools Score Championships 2018; Yvette Baker Trophy Final 2019; Southern Championships 2019.

6.1 JK 2021 will be hosted by SWOA on 02-05 April 2021. Richard Sansbury is asking clubs for suitable venues. Julie Astin WSX reports the WSX committee have suggested Penhale and the coordinator should be local to that area. [Richard Sansbury, Christine Vince](#)

6.2 Officials for Level B events. The new SWOA document 'SWOA Officials for Level B and A Events' was discussed. Christine Vince proposed that sufficiently experienced Level B planners should not need to attend a regional Level B Planners' course. Officials already appointed for SWOA Level B events in 2016: Harvester Relays, Caddihoe Chase, Salisbury City race, Southern Night Championships were acknowledged. The appointment and training of Safety Officers was queried. Christine Vince to re-issue the document to the committee, asking for comments. 6.3 British Sprint and Middle Championships 2018. Coordinator Christine Vince has discussed mapping issues for Stock Hill (Middle Distance event) with Trevor Crowe BOK. Trevor has agreed to take on responsibility for the Stock Hill map and will ask BML to laser print the current map at 1:10000 and 1:7500 as samples. BOF Rules Appendix D says that the Middle Distance map scale is 1:10000, with 1:7500 for older competitors; the planner Ben Chesters SARUM has requested a variation to use 1:7500 for all competitors. 6.4 Conflict of neighbouring club and association events. Richard Sansbury has agreed to send a reminder to SWOA clubs asking them to make a courtesy contact to neighbouring clubs in order to reduce potential conflict of event dates. Conflict between neighbouring associations has been experienced by NWO and other SWOA clubs on the fringes of the area. It was suggested the clubs involved should contact other associations to reduce date conflict there. **Richard Sansbury**

The committee noted that the current Event Safety Workshop administration information from BOF still needs updating; Katy Dyer has sent details to BOF with no response. - c) Event Safety Workshops. Katy Dyer BOK will run one for SWOC in 1st week of October in Cardiff and one for BOK on 01 November in Bristol. **Katy Dyer**

8.4 SWOA Planning Conference, 10 December 2016. Proposal from Roger Hargreaves KERNO, received enthusiastically by the chairman. Principal topics: Planning for Sprint, Urban and Middle Distance Races. Speakers tba but we will invite top people to present. Of interest to planners and controllers, but open to all (including adjacent regions). Proposed that, subject to presentation of a budget by the organiser Roger Hargreaves, there be no charge (refreshments but bring your own lunch). Clubs to be notified ASAP. **Christine Vince**

9. Controllers

Julie Astin WSX was approved as Gde C controller. The Recorder of Controllers' report is attached; see [Appendix 5](#).

10. Development

10.1 SWOA Colour Coded badges. 50 off White badges have been ordered @ £3.25 + VAT . Once old stock used up, an increase in badge cost to orienteers is proposed: from £1 to £1.50 juniors and from £2 to £3 seniors. **Christine Vince**

10.2 Succession planning for Event Officials. Mark Dyer's paper and Chris James' updated letter had been circulated to clubs prior to the meeting. There was much discussion about the number of Level D and C events in SWOA and how this affects the number of officials in 'training' for higher grade events. It was agreed that SWOA should be encouraging more Level C events (i.e. more Level D events could/should be run as Level C). The benefits of Level C events are that they have ranking points, they give officials recordable experience, and therefore we are missing a great opportunity here. Galoppen dates would continue to be protected; however, we should learn to live with two Level Cs at opposite ends of the region. SWOA will ask clubs for suggestions for how this can be promoted successfully. For further detail and comment from WSX see [Appendix 6](#). **Christine Vince**

11. Coaching

Appointment of the new Association Coaching Representative. Becca Jackson has offered and been gratefully accepted to be the new SWOA Association Coaching Representative. Becca cannot attend the Coaching meeting in Birmingham on 04 June so Christine Vince will go instead.

12.2 A new SWOA document 'SWOA Guidelines for Event Safety Workshop tutor appointment and workshop administration' has been written by Katy Dyer and circulated to clubs. It will go on the SWOA website. **Katy Dyer**

13. British Orienteering O-Safe document: A Guide to Safeguarding Children and At-risk Adults.

13.1 There is a 4-page Summary as well as the 33-page main document. It is a BOF requirement that club officials read these documents. SWOA's recommendations regarding who should read these documents are given in [Appendix 7](#).

13.2 Clubs need to have the wording of O-Safe - Appendix B within their constitutions. Information will be sent before the AGM. **Christine Vince, Katy Dyer**

13.3 Richard Sansbury asked how the rule saying ‘there must be two adults with a lone child’, affects ‘shadowing’ of a child by a single coach (i.e. not a family member). **Christine Vince**

Officials for Level B events

There is a new SWOA document 'SWOA officials for Level A and B events' which has been circulated to the committee and to club chairmen/secretaries.

BOF Rules, Appendix C says that the Association has the responsibility for appointing Level B officials; I would hope that we can implement this with as little fuss as possible.

To begin with, this meeting (on behalf of the Association) should acknowledge those officials who are already in place for events in the immediate future (which is likely to be those over the next 12 months or so). For the future, we need to consider those who wish to officiate at Level B events and are already sufficiently experienced; I do not see a need for these people to do a Level B Planning Course, and I hope that the committee will agree with me on that.

I envisage that the Level B Planning Course will be for those people who wish to officiate at Level B events but do not yet have sufficient experience, but are ready to step up from Level D and C events. I would hope that clubs will continue to run their own courses for event officials, to train new volunteers for Level D and C events and provide a pool from which we can draw our future Level B officials.

Both events were advertised by putting events on our NWO facebook page and on the SWOA facebook page. They were put on the BOF website. I also emailed a flyer to all SWOA club secretaries to send out to all of their members as well as to the local SCOA clubs. Despite my best efforts to advertise this as widely as possible, the take up from other clubs was disappointing.

We worked our way through the workshop booklet that I have put together using the resources that I received from BOF and from the workshop that I attended in Bristol. This involved looking at the BOF rules, Appendix E, knowledge about the insurance, risk assessments, accident report forms, missing runner search plans and creating our own event using some very well behaved Sylvanians with their tents, camper vans, toilets, cars and a very treacherous competition area.

Feedback

All of the feedback was extremely positive:-

- Very useful to be able to informally discuss all of the issues.
- Despite having attended a previous course I gained some important information on this occasion. This suggests that refresher training is of value as a reminder of responsibilities and as an update on revised BOF procedures.

Appendix 6 to SWOA Minutes, 16 March 2016
Succession planning and WSX comment

Chris James sent out an update to his letter "Something Old, Something New", just before the last SWOA meeting. In addition, a paper that Mark Dyer issued last year entitled "Succession Planning for Event Officials" has not yet been considered by the SWOA committee and, in light of the latest minutes from the Events and Competitions Committee, should be discussed in conjunction with SWOA's future training course requirements.

WSX: the report by Mark Dyer was discussed at our committee meeting last night and we have the following comments to make on his deductions:

- Instead of saying "Require a Controller for all level D events etc....", we believe it should say "Make it OPTIONAL to have a Controller for all level D events....and this would count towards the requirement to become a Grade Controller"
- We agree with the next two bullet points
- We were uncertain whether the "Accept a travel-time rather than a regional restriction on simultaneous level C events" was really relevant or practical. Travel time from where? You could have an event in Cornwall and the New Forest on the same day, for example (which would meet the travel time criteria, I presume, between the event venues themselves) but the travel time of someone living in the middle would probably not meet the travel time criteria. (Hope this makes sense) Also, there is also arguably a greater issue with conflicting events in adjacent regions (this has happened on more than one occasion in recent years with Wessex events and clubs in South Central). Is there - or should there be - great liaison between adjacent regional Fixtures Secretaries?

Appendix 7 to SWOA Minutes, 19 May 2016
British Orienteering O-Safe document and Summary recommended club readers.

There is a 4-page Summary as well as the 33-page main O-Safe document. I would recommend this:

Chairmen and secretaries of SWOA and the clubs should read the Summary and O-Safe.

The Club Welfare Officers of SWOA and the clubs must read the Summary and O-Safe.

The Licensed Coaches of SWOA and the clubs must read the Summary and O-Safe; regular helpers should read O-Safe.

SWJOS: senior Squad management must read the Summary and O-Safe; regular helpers should read O-Safe.

Club members who help frequently at club events (e.g. on Registration, Download) and who can be considered to be "known friendly faces" to children must be asked to read the Summary and should read O-Safe.
