Colour Coded Awards

To qualify you must be within the first 50% of all starters or within 1½ times the winner's time in the results on the same colour course, 3 times in any 2 years.

For WHITE courses you only need to complete the course 3 times.

STRING COURSE (PURPLE) is for any young person who does not already hold any other colour award, and who has completed 3 string courses.

To obtain a colour coded badge award please let me have the 3 dates on which you qualified (anywhere in Britain). Badges cost £1.50 for Juniors (20 & under) or £2.50 for Seniors (21 & over) – please note the change in price, as SWOA has ordered some new badges (these prices are subsidised by SWOA). Interland 2018

A report from Jack Forrest DEVON:

Rob and I set off from Islington at 8:30 on Friday morning and drove up to Beaconsfield to meet the rest of the team. We all set off by coach to the ferry crossing and onward to Oost-Dunkirk where we spent the night in a youth hostel and received our England attire. The following morning, we were up bright and early continuing our journey to Herperduin via a stop in the city of Breda.

That afternoon was a practice event on an area just south of the Interland race (the maps did overlap slightly). The area was similar to a sand dune in places with 2 ½ metre contours, surrounded by flat landscape and a path grid. I found this event very enjoyable on a nice fast area with very well mapped vegetation although the competition was tough, my time of 36 minutes (6th) put to shame by the winning 28 minutes.

In the evening there was a night sprint although I didn't run in this, my aim was to prepare for the next day's event. That morning I got up at 8 and made my way over at 8:45 to meet my start which was at 9:33. It was my first time running for England and I did find the pressure got to me as I sprinted off having a slight 'headless chicken' moment before finding my first control. The rest of the run was not as smooth as I would have liked it to have been and as a result my performance was less well placed, coming 11th out of 13 in the M17 class. However, the team did well and England secured 2nd place.

A report from Lucy Tonge BOK :



I was very surprised to be selected to run W20 for England at Interland this year, held in Holland but had another great experience. We were lucky to miss both the weekends of snow and it was actually rather warm when running. We had lovely accommodation, called Herperduin, in the east of Holland near Oss, where we stayed in little chalets and cottages. They were right next to the area which was very convenient as we could just roll out of bed and head to the start!

On the Saturday we had a training run in the afternoon adjacent to the competition area the following day. It was very helpful to run on the terrain as we realised it was a very pathy area and it was easier to run on them than cut through the forest, and we discussed possible things that could catch us out the

following day. That evening we all enjoyed a lovely meal at the event centre restaurant before some people headed out on a night sprint.

On Sunday morning we all walked over to the start, only 300m from our cottage so hardly much time for a warm up! The area was mostly forested and sandy underfoot. With the huge number of paths and very little climb, only 2.5m contours, it was a very fast race and mistakes were costly. Fortunately I had a good run coming 7th and thoroughly enjoyed it. Also from BOK, Harry and Bryony Stagg both had good runs in their first Interland competition and Clive and Jackie Hallett as usual had excellent runs, with podium positions. Unfortunately, despite the England successes, we came 2nd to the Belgian Flanders team so the challenge is on for next year to regain the title. Thank you very much to BOK and SWOA for their support.
