Appendix 2 to SWOA Minutes, 09 October 2018

Fixtures Secretary's report

I am currently trying to assemble the programme for next summer's relays and next season's Galoppen league. I am still waiting responses from some clubs.

I will be attending an Event Scheduling Group meeting in Birmingham on 20th October. This meeting agrees dates and allocates responsibilities for major events, leagues and competitions.

In our region I have asked for bids for the following events by 14th October, so strictly new offers may still emerge, but here is the latest status:

- 1) Yvette Baker qualifier in 2019. Two offers so far: DEVON on 24th March at their Devon League Event at River Dart Country Park, and NWO at their Galoppen on 7th April at Savernake. **SWOA need to make a choice between these two offers.**
- 2) South West Sprint Championships 2019: One offer from Devon for Exeter University on 2nd June. Strictly this does not fit within the 24 month embargo for the JK 2021, but Event Scheduling Group is likely to allow this. **Is this acceptable to SWOA?** If this is a problem then Devon will try to use Bicton instead.
- 3) South West Middle Distance Championships for 2019. No offers yet, and no obvious candidates. **Any suggestions?**
- 4) Southern Night Championships in 2019. Two offers: Both BOK and WSX/WIM expressed an interest, but WSX/WIM would drop out if they do the Caddihoe Chase in 2020 instead (see below). That would leave BOK on 30th November at Yoxter as the only offer, and BOK's Galoppen would be on 1st December to make a weekend of it.
- 5) Caddihoe Chase in 2020. One offer from WSX/WIM jointly. No date or venue yet.

Other events:

- 6) British Schools Score Championships. WIM is hosting this National Final on 13th October at Moors Valley.
- 7) CompassSport Cup. After the cancellation of the QO heat in 2018, QO will try again in 2019, and NGOC have agreed to defer theirs from 2019 to 2020.
- 8) Yvette Baker Trophy Final. BOK is hoping to host the final on 5th July 2020 at Westonbirt.
- 9) JK. We are hosting the 2021 JK festival, as I'm sure we all know!
- 10) British Night Championships. I have agreed to try to find a host for this in our region in 2022.

Galoppen Proposal from BOK

Our proposal has two parts. The first relates to a potential name change and the second relates to the way the current regional league operates.

Change of name from 'Galoppen' to 'Regional'

Our sport continues to struggle to attract new participants, and especially to bring in more younger orienteers. As a club, we're trying to reduce confusing terminology and make our events more welcoming and accessible. Other clubs in the region have been doing likewise. The name 'Galoppen' for our series of Regional events seems to us to be an example of jargon that is confusing and potentially off-putting to non-orienteers. Many of our own members don't even know what the word 'Galoppen' means, how a Galoppen event differs from other events, or indeed that there is a regional Galoppen League. We would like to propose an alternative and more easily understood title, ideally 'Regional Event' and 'Regional League'.

Widening of Regional League to include all Regional events

Across the seven courses that are included in the current Galoppen League, the average number of competitors who attended at least five events (to get a score) was only 7.1 in the 2017/18 season. Maximum participation was on the Green course (where 17 people achieved at least 5 results), but there were fewer than 10 with a qualifying set on five of the courses, and only one or two on Light Green, Orange and Yellow. The competition is between the rather small number of people who make it to five events or more.

Yet SWOA clubs put on 28 Regional rural events in the season September 2017 to August 2018. These comprised the 9 Galoppens plus 19 others. For those who can't get to five or more Galoppens, it seems like a missed opportunity not to include some of these others in the league.

We would therefore like the committee to consider widening the Regional league to include all Regional events, not just nine of them. A sub-set of results would still be used to calculate the league scores.

This change could potentially allow many more people to attend a qualifying set of events, and to do so without travelling such long distances, and thus potentially make the league larger and more dynamic. It could especially benefit those located at our extremities by bringing more qualifying events within easy driving distance. It might be said that removing the special status of Galoppens could disfavour smaller clubs as these are useful money-spinners, but the league rules could still require competitors to attend a least one event organised by each SWOA club, so that the clubs who only organise one Regional event per year (i.e. their Galoppen) would not expect to see a drop in attendance. In 2017/18 those clubs were QO, SARUM, WIM and WSX. The other clubs organised between one and six Regional events that were not Galoppens (KERNO led with six), so would have a good selection of additional events included in the league.

It might also be said that Galoppens attract high participation due to their special status. While I haven't gone into the attendance stats in detail, in the case of BOK we do not see any significant increase in attendance because of the Galoppen status. Attendance is related more to the attractiveness of the area on offer (so we will always get 250+ for a Forest of Dean event, whether or not it's a Galoppen).

If the principle of widening the league was supported, then details would need to be worked out. For example, the number of qualifying events would need to be agreed, and could be a lower percentage than at present (e.g. 7 or 8 per season?); a scoring system would also be needed that did not unduly reward someone for placing high in a relatively small or weak field (something similar to the BOF ranking system).

We're hoping that myself or another BOK committee member will be able to put forward these ideas in person at the committee meeting. Thanks for the committee's consideration.

Comment from Spencer Modica QO SWOA Galoppen scorer

I think Mathew and BOK make some excellent points. I have long worried about the lack of qualifying competitors on the more junior courses and I can't even spell Galoppen! I therefore support both proposals, especially if we can determine that all SWOA members have access to 5 events within TBD miles/minutes.

In the past, my experience of QO events is that the Galoppen attendance is always higher than for normal league events, but that difference is probably more in the region of 120 competitors, vs 60 to 80 (250 a distant dream). I would therefore expect the smaller clubs to want to ensure that there are no clashes between theirs and other "regional" events.

From a scorer perspective I have got to the point where it takes around 2 to 3 hours to update the league table and send it for publication - depending on the wide range of formats that SWOA clubs choose to send the information in (some I really struggle with) and how many competitors don't have a BOF number or are using a shortened version of their name - I would therefore not volunteer for an unlimited number of events but would be content to do more.

SW Junior Orienteering Squad Report

Over the summer more than a quarter of the SWJOS squad were away on national summer training camps, which they'd earned from their results at the major championships last Spring. We also enjoyed Flurry Grierson (M16 Devon) competing at European Youth Orienteering Champs, finishing a brilliant 14th and first Brit in the Long race.

A large team of SWJOS juniors and parents helped in several roles at the British Sprint & Middle Championships in September and also delivered some excellent results including several podium places:

Sprint Champs - Tom Perry 1st M14, Ruby Owen 1st W14, Jim Bailey & Olly Tonge 1st & 2nd M16

Middle Champs – Lucy Tonge 2nd W18

Mention should also be made of recent ex-SWJOS members Eddie Narbett, Chloe Potter and Cecilie Andersen who have all been competing for GB over the summer and all appeared on the podium at Stockhill.

The 2018-19 season started with a very full programme of races during September and October, which has limited the squad's early season training – there's only been one weekend without a significant junior competition in that period! Our major event is the Junior Inter-Regional Championships, held at Chatsworth a few weeks ago. Despite the majority of the squad being in the lower year of their age class, we had a strong team. However, gaps in M14 and W16 left us vulnerable to injuries or mis-punches. Excellent results in the Individual race placed us only a few points off the podium on Saturday, but numerous errors and a mis-punch in the girls' Relay wiped out 25% of our points on Sunday and dropped SWJOS to 5th overall.

This season we say goodbye to Harry McMurtrie and Dom Walker (DEVON) who are now at university, and Millie Stagg and Lucy Tonge (BOK) who move up to W20 after Christmas. We look forward to introducing a number of younger juniors to SWJOS this autumn, who are striving to expand their orienteering experience and improve their skills, including several from the Dorset clubs.

Our training this season starts with an athletics track session and 3km time trial during October, followed by a training day at Ham Hill on 27th October. Our M/W16s will then be off to the annual Hawkshead weekend with all the junior squads on 01/02 December, before the squad gets together for its Christmas weekend in the Forest of Dean on 08/09 December. Jim Bailey BOK and Flurry Grierson Devon will also be training monthly with the National Talent Squad this season.

In 2019, we have a training day on 12 January, followed by a residential Dartmoor weekend on 23/24 February to prepare everyone for the major championships during March-May.

SWJOS provides development opportunities for junior athletes who are usually bottom year M/W14 or older, willing and able to travel widely for their orienteering, currently competing on Light Green courses, keen to progress beyond club orienteering to compete in major races nationally and progress towards the British Orienteering Talent Development Programme.
